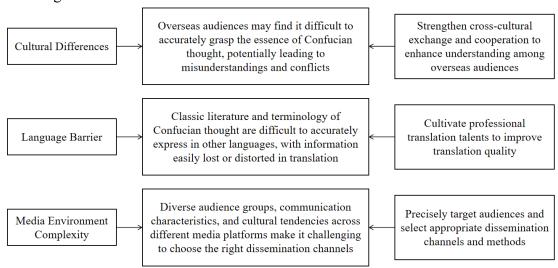


Figure 1 Challenges and coping strategies for the overseas dissemination of Confucianism
